Projects Queensland (PQ) has delivered the fitout for a fabulous Gucci store of 600m2 at 161 Collins Street, Melbourne. The design and conceived concept Gucci's Creative Director Michele Alessandro features the company's complete collection men's and women's ready-to-wear fashion. jewellery, accessories, shoes and handbags.

Projects Director Craig Stewart said the store location in a prominent corner position of the heritage listed T&G building presented PQ's team with major structural challenges to open up the new space.









"The structural alteration component required significant steel framing support – we were faced with an undefined completion program for these alterations. We worked closely with Gucci's consulting engineers to complete these complex construction elements and meet Gucci's opening plans. We had previously fitted out a Gucci men and women's store in the same building and the new tenants for


this space had a tight occupancy program so we had double deadlines to move Gucci out and into their luxurious new premises. The store features unique Gucci designed floor tiling, exotic rugs, softly coloured wall surfaces, mixed with traditional, modern, industrial design elements that highlight the product range complemented with strategic lighting designs.

Paspaley Perth a prestige pearl paradise

Earlier this year Brad Dunne received the news that Paspaley had awarded PQ the contract for a new store at Perth's Crown Casino. Following the successful build at Crown, Paspaley moved quickly with the appointment of PQ for a new store, at Chadstone Shopping Centre in Melbourne.

General Manager Global Retail for Paspaley, Richard Broug, said both boutiques formally opened in October bringing us to eight standalone retail outlets nationally.

Australian store in Sydney. PQ's Senior Project Manager Josh Turner was responsible for fitout of both Céline entries into Australia. The 186m2 store design has clean lines and pared-back simplicity, hallmarks of the brand's creative

director, Phoebe Philo.

Josh said quality raw materials were specified, such as onyx, fired terracotta, carved lime wood and industrial chipboard complemented with foliage, and black metal hanging rails.
