Louis Vuitton expands - Queens Plaza Brisbane





Long-time client, the luxury global brand Louis Vuitton (LV) appointed Projects Queensland to refurbish and expand their Queens Plaza store. The expansion significantly increases the footprint and the construction team was led by Project Manager Josh Turner.

This new store design was created by

LV's in-house architects based in Paris. "Our highly regarded relationship with LV started on the Gold Coast in 1992 and we are proud of continued relationship with this acclaimed global brand," said PQ's director managing Brad Dunne.

Josh Turner said the luxurious refurbishment and expansion of LV's Brisbane boutique was a major project and includes the original Edward Street space, with additional retail, VIC salon and office spaces. "The store design is a first for Australia and part of LV's latest global strategy," observed Josh Turner.

Another Edward Street first not a luxury store - rather a luxury apartment refit. A close collaboration designer Samantha Ritch (COX Architecture), PQ's Andy Wingate and the client was established for a total refit of this apartment, one of two on level 24. Gucci makes a move in Melbourne

Gucci entrusted PQ to deliver their temporary 415m2 store at 18-20 Russell Street in Melbourne's CBD. Craig Stewart was project manager and site foreman was Troy MacNaughtan. (Craig also built Gucci's 700m2 flagship store at Westfield Sydney). Delivery time for Russell Street was 28



days observed Craig. "We worked with Gucci's site representative Mr Joseph Vu from Gucci Singapore to produce an on-time delivery," he said. Italian wall fixtures formed part of the build and the floor counters were manufactured by PQ. Gucci's new 500m2 CBD presence is under construction at 161 Collins Street. PQ assisted Gucci staff for the overnight transfer from the closed Collins St Store to Russell Street. The temporary store will operate until the October move to the new 500m2 store at 161 Collins Street.

Escada at \$100m Homebush outlet

Escada's highly visible factory outlet of 100m2 has been completed by the Projects Queensland team of Josh

Turner as Project Manager and Troy MacNaughtan as site foreman. The store is located within Sydney's leading factory outlet at DFO Homebush featuring 126 stores. Escada is a valued previous client of Projects Queensland. The design of this store is light and airy and features a great 'show window' display Josh said PQ built during



construction. Escada's store at Chadstone Shopping Centre, the biggest in Australia and this store is their first factory outlet. "Escada is one of the world's leading womens-wear brands and present in 80 countries," explained Josh. The design was produced by Escada's in-house architects and Josh worked with Rebecca Jackes, Head of Escada Retail operations.

Construction giant, ADCO Constructions contracted PQ to supply joinery components for 150 rooms for



this facility - included were 108 bedrooms and the kitchen. Manuel Pena said PQ's Stewart Campbell oversaw the progressive installation of all the joinery components manufactured by PQ at Molendinar.

www.jacksonteece.com , the facility offers low and high care, dementia specific units and with extra hotel style offerings. "It was rewarding to be working with ADCO again following the Abedian School of Architecture project at Bond University - we appreciated the assistance received from ADCO's Contract Administrator Jarvis Robertson and Project Manager Clay Hart in facilitating the delivery of our contract," said Manuel.

The construction laminates and the quality build of the cabinetry specified by Jackson Teece will provide long-term serviceability for BUPA. Over the next three years BUPA Aged Care plans to invest more than \$200 million in new developments in Australia.
